













Separation and Disposal of Household Waste

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Drain the liquid completely with a sink strainer. 2. Wrap the waste in newspaper (two pieces of paper or less) 3. Place the waste in a designated paper bag and tie it with a hemp string. 4. Write your name. 5. Place the waste in a designated paper bag and take it to a combustible waste collection area. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Place the waste in a transparent or white and half-transparent bag and take it out. 2. Take it to a combustible waste collection area. <p>*Refrain from putting food scraps. *Dispose of dirty plastic containers as combustible waste.</p> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Rinse plastic containers and remove the dirt from them. 2. Place the waste in a transparent or white and half-transparent bag and take it out. 3. Take it to a combustible waste collection area. <p>*Do not place the waste in two layers of bags. Only use one bag at a time.</p> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Cut to a thickness of 10 cm and length of 60 cm at most and bundle the branches. 2. Use a hemp or paper string to tie them up. 3. Take it to a combustible waste collection area. <p>*Dispose of plants that are poisonous, rich in fiber, or infected by pests as combustible waste.</p> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Place the waste in a transparent or white and half-transparent bag and take it out. 2. Divide trash into 4 bags. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Rinse lightly and remove the dirt from them. 2. Place pet bottles in blue containers. 3. Place bottles and cans in orange containers. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tie crosswise with strings. 2. Place it next to the containers. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Take bulky non-combustible waste, regular non-combustible waste, bottles, cans, and pet bottles to the Recycling Center directly. 2. Take bulky combustible waste and regular combustible waste to the Central Waste Management Center directly. 3. Take pruned branches, plastic containers, and used paper and clothes to the South Waste Management Center directly. 4. Ask a waste disposal operator in town to dispose of the waste. (Transportation charges apply.) <p>*Please note that the place for you to throw your waste differs depending on the type.</p> 

<h3>Used batteries</h3>  <p>Take them out of your bag and place it in collection containers installed in the town hall, community centers, Hope Center, Kirari Center, meeting halls and other public spaces.</p>	<h3>Used small electrical appliances</h3>  <p>Take them out of your bag and place it in boxes installed in the town hall, Hope Center, and Kirari Center. The opening of the box is 15 cm x 30 cm.</p>	<h3>Waste cooking oil</h3>  <p>Pour it into a pet bottle or other similar containers, and put it in the collection container installed at the entrance of the town hall.</p>	<h3>Waste that is not collected by the town</h3>  <p>Waste oil, Paint, Batteries, Tires/Alloy wheels, Bowling balls, Construction waste, Medical waste, Concrete/Blocks/Bricks, Pesticides, Motor-bikes, Fire extinguishers, Soil, Rocks, Stones etc.</p> <p>Waste that cannot be treated at the waste management center will not be collected. Please consult the place where you purchased the item or dedicated operators.</p>
